Assistance with Care and Housing for the Aged

Assistance with Care and Housing for the Aged (ACHA) provides help for people that are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. Assistance is given to find suitable, affordable, accommodation, and to link them into services to provide ongoing care.

What support may be offered?

- / Help to find secure, affordable housing
- / Liaising with local support groups, community groups and health services
- / Advocating on housing or tenancy issues and financial or legal services
- / Telephone and face-to-face assistance and counselling

How will ACHA help me?

The program links you to the most appropriate range of housing and care services in order to meet your most immediate needs. We can offer support to find housing, assist with finding home care packages, local and state services, financial and legal services, and residential care options.

Am I eligible to use the services?

ACHA services are available to people aged 65 or over, who are on a low income, and who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless.

ACHA services are available in the Mid North, Copper Coast, York Peninsula, Clare and Wakefield rural areas of South Australia.

What does it cost?

There are no fees associated with the ACHA program but clients will be responsible for their own accommodation costs.
