Unit types and fee options

There are three fee options available for Retirement Living with Helping Hand.

Resident Funded Units (RFU)

Resident funded units are allocated at market value. You enter into a lease/licence agreement that provides you with a licence to reside in the unit. When you leave your unit, you are repaid within 30 days. Your repayment is based on the value determined by a licensed valuer less the amount retained by Helping Hand as per the resident agreement.

Entry Contribution Units (ECU)

A number of our retirement units simply require you to pay a one-off entry contribution. This fee varies depending on the unit and location. The payment of an affordable entry fee means that you have the right to occupy the unit for life, or until you choose to leave. A refundable portion is repaid within the first four years only.

Rental Units (RU) (Affordable Housing)

Rental units are income assessed and allocated to those most in need. All residents pay weekly rent (debited monthly), which covers services offered by the village, with the exception of general household expenses such as telephone, electricity and contents insurance.

Recurrent Fees

While living in one of our Retirement Living Units, we will take care of the maintenance for you. You pay a recurrent fee, debited monthly, which covers the following:

- / Repairs and maintenance of your unit – mechanical, electrical, plumbing, and pest control
- / Gardening in common areas including front gardens and clearing of pathways
- / Communal electricity and gas costs
- / Access to 24/7 emergency maintenance
- / SA Water charges
- / Council rates
- / Emergency Services Levy
- / Cleaning of common areas
- / Helping Hand staff and administration costs

Your Responsibilities

As a resident in a Helping Hand retirement living unit, you are required to cover the costs of expenses in your home which may include electricity, phone, internet, contents insurance and/or gas.

Assistance to remain independent in your retirement unit

At Helping Hand, we understand the importance of being able to do what you love in your own home. We offer a range of care options to support you to remain at home across metropolitan Adelaide and regional South Australia.

You may be eligible for assistance through the Commonwealth Home Support Program, or a Home Care Package. A range of home support services may be provided under these programs, including but not limited to the following:

- / Bathing and dressing
- / House cleaning, laundry and ironing
- / Gardening, grocery shopping and local transport
- / Health supplies and clinical care (medication and wound care)
- / Helping you get back on your feet after a hospital stay
